Our services are designed to help participants overcome barriers faced when furthering their education, skills and personal development. Our program empowers and installs positive life-long changes through culture, values, and strength by incorporating Indigenous learning modalities.

About the Program

The Bridging to Employment program assists Indigenous people 16 years and older who are unemployed, under-employed, or wanting to improve their skills to enter the workforce. Participants can access relevant education, training and skill development to assist them in achieving self-sufficiency and a holistic sense of well-being.

Services that we offer:

- Basic computer literacy education
- Life Skills training
- Assistance with resume, cover letters and interview preparation
- Connecting students with relevant training and work experience
- Post Secondary and upgrading orientation
- Bah'lats model graduation ceremony

The Prince George program is nine weeks, and is offered three times a year. The Burns Lake program is ten weeks, and is offered four times a year.
